W Caught on the Run

Jonah foolishly thought he could run from God, but God sends an intense storm to thwart his escape. Ironically, the pagan sailors Jonah is sailing with demonstrate a greater fear of God and show more interest in saving lives than Jonah does. What a tragedy it would be for the followers of Christ today if those outside the church show greater compassion for people than we do.

- Read Jonah 1:4. Jonah was on the run after God had called him to bring the message of repentance to Nineveh. But Jonah doesn't get very far before God pursues him with a wild storm. God is willing to rock our world to get our attention. How have you experienced God's pursuit of you to draw you closer to Him?
- 2. Read Jonah 1:5-6. The unbelieving sailors are praying and trying to save lives, while the prophet of God is checked out doing nothing.
 - Can you think of examples where unbelievers seem more concerned with the well being of others than believers do?
 - As Christ-followers we should be the greatest advocates for loving and caring for all people. In what ways do you think we as believers can better demonstrate God's love to the world?
- 3. Read Jonah 1:7-10. When the lot fell on Jonah and the sailors asked him for an explanation, Jonah says that he fears God, the One who created the sea and the land. But it's quite confusing and terrifying to the sailors that he says he fears God and yet he's disobeying and running from God. In what ways do you think the world around us could be confused by contradictions they see in the lives of Christians?
- 4. Read Jonah 1:11-16. Even in Jonah's disobedience, God still uses his life to bring these pagan sailors to saving faith.
 - How do you think Jonah felt about the compassion of the sailors, who, rather than throw him overboard, try to get the boat to dry land (vs. 13)?
 - Can you think of an example from your life, or someone you know, where God worked in spite of you and your brokenness?
- 5. Instead of running from God, how can you intentionally draw near to Him this summer? If you don't already have a plan for your time with God, consider reading through the gospels this summer and learning from the life of Christ. (See the Deeper Study). How can you encourage one another in your walk with Jesus during our Community Group break over the summer?
