Biblical marriage requires one man and one woman to come together as husband and wife. We are created in God's image, male and female, unique and distinct from one another, and that difference is not something to be devalued but to be celebrated. In biblical marriage, we see one husband and one wife, unique as male and female, united in the gospel.

1. Read 1 Corinthians 11:2-6

- What does it mean to be distinct in gender roles, but equal in worth? How have you seen today's culture support or oppose this view?
- When Paul speaks about authority it has nothing to do with equality. This authority is loving, serving, and life-giving. Is it difficult for you to view authority in this way? Why or why not?
- During this time, women wore head coverings as a sign of honor towards their husbands. In today's culture, how can women show honor to their husbands and men show honor to their wives?
- 2. Read 1 Corinthians 11:7-12 Paul wants us to look at the archetypes (Adam and Eve) and not enforce the stereotypes of gender.
 - Read Genesis 2:18-25. What does this passage teach us about the uniqueness and unity of man and woman?
 - How can we focus on the archetypes (or model) of our respective roles and learn from that?
 - What stereotypes or perceptions of gender roles are most prevalent in our culture? How can we look at those stereotypes with a biblical lens?
- 3. Read 1 Corinthians 11:13-16 Biblical masculinity and femininity are far richer than the stereotypes that today's culture reinforces.
 - How does current culture define gender versus how the Bible defines gender?
 - Both men and women are image bearers of Christ. How can we live out this truth?

In your breakout groups, spend some time praying for one another.
